Tips for learning the alphabet

Following the clinical decision that a patient requires non-invasive respiratory support, eligible patients should be randomised as close as possible to time that they will start the treatment. This will help ensure that, by the time of randomisation, patients do still indeed require non-invasive respiratory support and that the randomised treatment will be started.

To help with local training and to raise awareness of FIRST-ABC - we have developed an online training course. The online training is primarily focused on the HFNC and CPAP treatment algorithms. The online training can be completed in full in less than 30 minutes or section-by-section (with each section taking around 5 minutes). Instructions on accessing the online training are provided following the site initiation visit.

FIRST-ABC is nested within the PICANet audit to help reduce the burden of data collection for site staff. If your unit participates in the PICANet audit, then please inform your unit's PICANet lead and ask them to record 'FIRST-ABC' and the patient's Trial Number in the field '*Is this patient on a clinical trial*?' for each recruited patient. Guidance on extracting data from PICANet web will be

provided in due course.
