

## Why SCARF?

SCARF is a multi-centre, randomised controlled trial to find out if early admission to the intensive care unit for CPAP results in more children recovering from severe breathing difficulties when compared to usual treatment.

## Eligibility: is the patient...

< 18 years old?</li>
Severely impaired immunity?
Acute respiratory failure or acute on chronic respiratory failure?
If yes, contact your local SCARF Team!

## Letter for potential patients

If you identify any potential patients (impaired immunity but do not have acute respiratory failure), please ensure that the letter for potential patients is given to the parent/ guardian as soon as possible. This will optimise the time that parents/guardians have to consider their child's participation in the trial.
