30 patients randomised!



We have got off to a great start already in 2015 with four patients recruited in 24 days! 30 patients have now been randomised to SCARF!



Data collection

Case Report Forms (CRFs) should be completed for the full 30 days, as long as the patient is in hospital (this is not dependent on the location of the patient in hospital). Once the CRF has been completed, it should be sent to ICNARC even if the child is still in hospital (e.g. at day 31).

Daily data collection will stop if the patient is discharged from hospital before day 30. However, if the patient is readmitted again during the 30 day period, then daily data collection should re-start. Daily data collection does not need to re-start for any follow up/outpatient visits after hospital discharge during the 30 day period (e.g. coming back as a day patient for other treatment).

It is recommended that CRF days are 24 hour periods from time of randomisation.



Safety monitoring

If there are no adverse events to record, please make sure you record a '0' under Severity for <u>all</u> specified events listed on the CRF. Very well done to all three participating hospitals
